RABAT, A MODERN CAPITAL WITH DEEP-ROOTED HISTORY

Rabat is a cultural city deep-rooted in history. Many masterpieces decorate its streets and squares. Crossing the walls is like entering another world ; walk among ancient vestiges, gardens and storks.

Rabat is also a modern eco-responsible capital with its green spaces. Beautiful parks await you. Rabat boasts an outstanding coastline ; on the Atlantic Ocean shores, it has kilometres of well equipped beaches that lead to the neighbouring city of Casablanca.

Rabat is a city where the treasures of the past blend with the most modern and environmentally friendly achievements.



Day 2: Friday 23 January 2026

11h00 - Upon arrival , visit to **Chellah**

Built in the XIV Century by the Merinid dynasty upon the ruin of the ancient Roman city of Sala Colonia, the Chellah necropolis is located at a distance of two kilometers from the city center, off the Almohad enclosure. According to historians and archeologists, the Chellah site was undoubtedly the most ancient human agglomeration ever set on the estuary of the Bouregreg River.



12h30- 13h30 visit of Hassan Tower & Mohamed V Mausoleum



The Hassan Tower is considered as the symbol of Rabat, it is one of the most famous sites of the kingdom. The Hassan tower remains the only vestige of what was to be, at the instigation of the Almohad sultan Yacoub Al Mansour (12th century), the largest mosque in the Muslim world. This oversized project was not going to survive, at the death of the latter, in the year 1199, nor later, the earthquake of Lisbon in 1755. Only his minaret 44 meters high, very close architecture Koutoubia de Marrakech and the Giralda of Seville survive and give its name to the monument: Hassan Tower.

Right in front of the Hassan Tower stands the mausoleum Mohammed V, a monument of unparalleled beauty. This monument is dedicated to the memory of the late monarch Mohammed V the Grand father of the actual King.

The visit of this monument is a great opportunity to appreciate the true value of traditional Moroccan art.

Outside, a magnificent white marble pavilion crowned with green tiles. Inside, the walls completely covered with "zellige", the ceiling with its motifs and sculptures on plaster and wood extremely refined demonstrate the ingenuity and know-how of the Moroccan master craftsmen.



13h30- 14h30 Lunch in Riad Al Bahi: a hidden treasure in the Medina of Rabat



In the heart of Rabat's medina, behind a discreet door, lies Riad Al Bahi , a sanctuary where past and present intertwine in captivating harmony. Once a forgotten ruin, this place has been transformed by Emmanuel and Hanane Muguet into a treasure trove of history and art where every detail whispers the soul of Morocco. Here, Andalusian-inspired arabesques mingle with contemporary works, weaving an intimate and universal narrative. Push open the door and let yourself be enchanted: a sensory and emotional experience awaits you, a blend of serenity and wonder.



Day 2: Friday 23 January 2026

14h30 - departure on foot to explore the souks & The Consuls Street

Drawing its name from the fact that it was the residence of foreign diplomats, the Consuls Street is one of the oldest and most famous alleys in the capital. "An inescapable passage in the sightseeing of the capital". The site has become a landmark.



15h00-16h00 visit of Kasbah Oudayas



Within a fifteen minute walk from the Rabat City Center stands the Kasbah of the Oudayas at the Bou Regreg estuary, a real fortress dating back to the XII century. With its monumental Almohade portal, the Kasbah is a gripping site which offers the visitor a never seen before beauty that encompasses the Andalusian style garden, a museum, some riyaads and some mosques

the Kasbah of the Oudayas has become for a good number of both Moroccan and world artists a haven of peace and inspiration. Visitors are seduced by the site's beauty, just as they are by its soothing calm. Doubtless, the Kasbah's greatest attraction remains the famous Moorish Café which can be accessed to through the winding streets

The construction of the **royal palace** of Rabat began in the middle of the 19th century on the ruins of an ancient palace. Also called Dar El Makhzen, majestic and protective, the building is a fine example of Moroccan art. Surrounded by an enclosure, its main entrance overlooks a vast esplanade, the Mechouar, is used for the outdoors royal ceremonies.

Special Happening : Every Friday after the middle prayer AL ASR the royal musical orchestra plays music for the public (Exception if there is rain or special royal activity in the palace the music will not be performed)

09h30 - Departure by bus to visit Hassan II Mosque

10h00-11h00 During your guided tour, we will lead you to a historical discovery of the Casablanca Hassan II Mosque and its outbuildings. You can admire the traditional Moroccan art in its entire splendor (plaster, carved wood, zellige, marble, tadelakt, copper).

The tour comprises three stages:

- Stage 1: Prayer Hall
- Stage 2: Minaret Hall
- Stage 3: ABLUTION HALL



11h00 - 12h30 Orienteering tour by bus to The coastline, Modern infrastructures are in the middle of charming districts, between Arab-Muslim heritage and legacies of the colonial period. Discover all the possibilities : take a stroll in the medina, which is one of latest medinas built in Morocco, roam through the centre and its art-deco buildings

13h00 - 14h30 Lunch in SCALA , offers typical Moroccan cuisine with fresh, high-quality produce, as well as a living and cultural entertainment space, where everyone can enjoy the sumptuous Andalusian garden .



15h30 - 17h00 Visit of Habous quartier :

Adjacent to the Royal Palace, the Habous Quarter was created during the French protectorate period. Start your visit with the Mahkama du Pacha, a sublime building of Hispano-Moorish inspiration. Free time to shop & explore the small streets.
